There are things that people don't like to do or they're afraid or they're uncertain. And let's be clear. The biggest part of it is fear of the unknown. I don't know this or I don't know if I am great at it. I don't know if I can learn it. And so, they have that fear on different aspects of their business or their directions, their dreams, whatever it is that they want to go for. And that's one of the things that holds them back.

So that's why I said one person's pain is another person's pleasure—meaning. when you are looking for those only quality people, like we talked about in the last podcast. Also kind of put into your mindset, who's good at what I am not. And if they are good at it, a lot of times, is they enjoy it. They enjoy it and that's why they are good at it!

So, let me kind of give you an example of what I am talking about. When it came to writing my book and getting my book out there, I knew that I had never written a book before and I'd never marketed a book before, I'd never launched a book before. And so, one of the people that love to do stuff like that is my business partner Jason. And Jason is a wiz at what he does. So he became a big part of that, only quality people, but he also loves it. Other things that Jason loves is he loves technology. He loves the behind the scenes. He loves programming. That's why he is the one doing the programming for AmentorA, to do version 2.0. Because that's the stuff he loves. He's the one that even as I record this podcast, I record them, I write the title, I write the subtitle, I do the description, all stuff that I can do quite easily. But, I have Jason upload it to iTunes to be able for people to get it and to launch each one, schedule each one for launch. So that's the stuff that I still have a little bit of fear in doing. For him, it's second nature. For him, he loves doing it. So that's the way I look at it.

When it came to, now I'll go back to another example, just kind of help draw this through examples. When my wife and I first bought our Domino's pizzas, we tried to do our accounting on our own. We hated it. We had fear in it. Our business partner, he was trying to do it. It wasn't stuff he liked to do but he was going to do it to save us money. And it was disastrous.

So after 3 years, we actually ended up separating our kind of partnership. We had once told we're left, just now caught up, we had now taken another store out of bankruptcy that we are operating. My first decision that we decided to do was let's find a good bookkeeper. And the city that our new store was in, which is in Westbank, British Columbia or today it's called West Kelowna Estates, we met a person who actually was one of our customers. Her husband was one of our drivers. She loves book keeping.

So what did we do? Instead of trying to do it on our own, we went to her and hired her as a bookkeeper. And I'll tell you, we learned very quickly. It's not just in time but in money alone, a great bookkeeper, a great accountant will save you way more money than it would ever cost you to pay them. And so now, here we were, saving money by having someone else doing it. We took that off of our mindset so we weren't trying to have to worry about doing it in life work. We took away a fear.

So that's kind of like I say, tying all 3 of these podcasts together is about surrounding yourself with great people, not trying to do it on your own. Look for quality people. But, also look for the people that love to do what you don't. Because, what you hate, what your fear is, there's people that love to do it and for them it's second nature. I don't care what realm it is. I don't care what area it is. If there's something that you don't like doing, I guarantee you there's someone who does.
